Chaplain's Corner

Brother Knights,

Last week I was asked about the use of a green pall during funerals. I understand that a green pall is used to show affiliation with the Knights of Columbus.

The pall is a symbol in itself. "A pall may be placed over the coffin when it is received at the church. A reminder of the baptismal garment of the deceased, the pall is a sign of the Christian dignity of the person," and is meant to be a symbol that "all are equal in the eyes of God." cf. Order of Christian Funerals #38, James 2:1-9. The pall is meant to make us anonymous. This is why, "insignia of association to which the deceased belonged are to be removed from the coffin at the entrance of the church. They may be replaced after the coffin has been taken from the church." Order of Christian Funerals #38. The deceased's identity during the Funeral is one of a Baptized Christian.

As for the color of the pall, the Church has chosen white (replacing black in the Extraordinary Form) as the normative color of the pall for very specific reasons. A Catholic Funeral is a celebration of the Resurrection of Christ, and of hope that the deceased will share in this as a result of their Christian Dignity which they receive at Baptism. "A reminder of the baptismal garment of the deceased, the pall is a sign of the Christian dignity of the person." Order of Christian Funerals #38. The Church typically uses white to express this as salvation is connected to the Resurrection of Christ and the celebration of Easter.

From the Baptismal Rite which the above calls to mind the Baptismal Garment, we read in #99, "(Name), you have become a new creation and have clothed yourself in Christ. May this white garment be a sign to you of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends to help you by word and example, bring it unstained into eternal life." The Order of Christian Funerals mirrors this and begins, "In the waters of baptism, (NAME) died with Christ and rose with him to new life. May he now share with him eternal glory." (#160)

This carries over to the image of eternal life and hope in being admitted to the Heavenly Banquet. "... before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands... These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?" I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb." Revelation 7:9, 13-14.

In short, it is a symbol of Baptism and Eternal life in Heaven in the presence of the Lord.

The Church gives us 3 colors which can be used at Funerals as found in the Roman Missal, the Ordo, and the Order of Christian Funerals. White is pretty much the standard.

- White which symbolized dignity, hope, eternal life, and a connection to Jesus' victory at Easter.
- Violet which symbolizes penance and mourning, and we are called to pray and do penance (as in Lent) for the departed soul.
- Black which symbolizes death and reflects sadness for the deceased. It emphasizes that the deceased need our prayers because they may have not yet seen the Face of God, but are being purified in the cleansing fires of purgatory.

With the symbolism of the white pall which the Church has given us, we are given the beautiful visual sign of Christian dignity, hope, and Resurrection with Christ in which we participate in the Paschal Mystery. The Church has given us these colors to help the faithful look beyond the present and into the truths of the Christian Faith, God's compassionate love, and on the Paschal Mystery of the Lord, as proclaimed in the Scripture readings.

The Church does provide an option, however, to show that the deceased was a member of the Knights of Columbus. The Order of Christian Funerals #131 and 132 states that, "the church is at once a symbol of the community and of the heavenly liturgy that the celebration of the liturgy anticipates," [therefore] "Any national flag or the flags or insignia of association to which the deceased belonged are to be removed from the coffin at the entrance of the church. They may be replaced after the coffin has been taken from the church."

This means that the casket would be already draped with the green "Knights" pall when it arrives at the church or at least before it is brought into the church. The green pall would remain on the casket until just before the start of the funeral. Before the funeral begins, it would be removed, and the white would be placed on the casket for the liturgical rites of the funeral. After the final blessing, the white would again be removed at the back of the church, the casket would be sprinkled with holy water, and the green placed back on for its journey to the place of committal.

This allows for the Knight's earthly identity to be seen "coming and going," and his identity as a Baptized child of God to be seen during the Church's Sacred Liturgy.

As we approach the holy Season of Lent, know of my prayers for each of you and your families.

Lord

May everything we do begin with your inspiration, continue with his help, and reach perfection under his guidance. Amen.
