Minutes of the June 8, 2023 Council 9667 Meeting

GK Eric Huff called the meeting to order at approximately 7:00 pm with 18 members in attendance.

The GK led us in reciting the Opening Prayer, Our Father, and Glory Be. The Warden led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Council sang the Opening Ode.

The roll call indicated that all officers were present or accounted for. Dignitaries present were acknowledged.

As the minutes of the previous meeting were published in the bulletin, a motion was made and seconded to dispense with their reading. The motion passed unanimously.

Grand Knight Report:

2. Our next opportunity to serve will be on Saturday, June 17th as we have been asked by the Parish office to help set up for Fr. Wayne's going away party on the following day, Sunday June 18th. I don't have a time yet so when you sign up please make sure your best contact phone number is on the sheet. This may be a last minute call from me to you.
3. As I mentioned, Fr. Wayne's party is on Sunday June 18th after the 11am Mass, I need brothers to help set up our BBQ and table set up for the food we will be preparing. I have a sign-up sheet for this task as well. Time on this one is from 9am until probably 2pm for cleanup. Please sign up even if you can only come for a portion of the time.
4. The parish Breakfast will be Sunday, June 25th - after the 8am and 9:30am Masses — any and all help is welcomed as we do not have students to

help us during the summer months, your participation is greatly appreciated.
