Fairview Developmental Center is a multi-service residential facility licensed by the California Department of Health Services to provide acute, skilled, and intermediate care to individuals with developmental disabilities who need 24-hour health care supervision, a structured environment, and a habilitation program not currently available in their home community. Services include training in daily living, vocational, leisure, academic, communication, mobility, socialization, and community skills. Services are provided both on campus and in community settings.

Local Knights of Columbus councils take turns to spend one Sunday morning a month visiting the center and transporting residents to the main hall where Mass is celebrated. Those who have performed this service have developed strong bonds with the residents, staff, and the priests. The dignity of the individual is paramount and that is why the State takes measures to ensure their safety and well-being.

When attending Mass at Fairview do not expect a solemn, quiet Service. It is often loud and a little distracting, but this is how the residents show their enjoyment and pleasure. Some of our friends walk in the entrance procession, some are altar servers, some read the intercessions, and others join the choir in song.

It is an uplifting experience and truly opens your eyes to how we all thank God for his goodness in our own way. **Don't wait - sign up now.**

Knights of Columbus Officers

My brothers, next month we will begin the process of electing our officers for Colombian year 2018-2019. As we have many new members in recent years, let us examine how our Council is organized.

The first set of officers are the ones who run the meetings and oversee the doing of the Council. They are called the “chairs” because by tradition they start at the bottom and move up each year through the various responsibilities the “chair” of the Grand Knight.

Let us start at the top.

Grand Knight: Is the leader of the council. He sets the tone for the course of the Colombian year. He appoints many of the other leaders. He forms the committees that do the many things we do. He is the CEO of the Council.

Deputy Grand Knight: Is the Grand Knight’s right arm. He fills in for the Grand Knight when he cannot be there. He has the responsibility to learn what and how the Grand Knight wants the Council to do and to help move it in that direction. He is also learning how to be a Grand Knight, which he will probably be in the following year. In our Council, the Deputy Grand Knight is also the Chairman of the Service Program in which he oversees the Service Committee Chairmen (explained later) and their projects.

Chancellor: Is the one on one representative of the Grand Knight to individual members of the Council and the Ombudsman from the council members to the Grand Knight and other officers. Often the officer’s need a reading of how the Council feels about a subject. Through his intimate contact with the individual members, he has a feel of where they are. In addition, members often have a project or a problem and they are unsure of which leader to present it to. The Chancellor is that member’s gateway, who will guide him on the path to take. Often the Grand Knight will assign the Chancellor other specific tasks.

Warden: Is responsible for all the paraphernalia of the council, for setting up the Chamber for meetings and for ceremonials. He and his guards are responsible for the conduct and good order of the members during any event i.e. meeting, ceremonial, etc. The Warden is also answerable to the Grand Knight for any other organizational task the Grand Knight assigns to him.

Outside and inside Guard: Are aides to the Warden in his duties. They also guard the doors and check that all who are admitted are in possession of the correct

current membership card. These positions are especially important at Holy Spirit because so many people are used to coming through Doyle Hall to enter the classroom area. The Warden and the Guards need to be able to courteously direct them to enter from the other end of the building.

These are the “Chairs” Ideally each officer will be elected to advance along a six year path to become our Grand Knight. However, this is not a hard and fast rule. Sometimes an officer will move out of the area, pass away, become incapacitated, decide that the Grand Knight’s responsibilities are beyond the scope he wants to enter, or in rare cases, it becomes obvious that the officer is not capable of handling the duties of Grand Knight.

In these, and other similar cases a new man is elected. Either by electing and moving up the members behind him, or by inserting and electing a member directly into that slot. It is also possible that a member will decide he would like to serve in a certain slot. He can run for that slot in the election.

We take the traditions of the “Chairs” seriously but as one can see, there are many scenarios which justify laying them aside.

The following are what I call the housekeeping positions:







Recorder: Keeps a concise record of the doings of the council. First by recording and archiving the minutes of each meeting and by building a history of the other events of the council. The recorder is elected each year at approved by the Council at the order of the Grand Knight. It is common for the Treasurer to be re-elected over a period of years as he develops a specific skill for the position.

Financial Secretary: Receives all funds forwarded to the Council. He records them and delivers them to the Treasurer. He is also responsible for keeping the Council roster up to date. Coordinating with the Supreme Membership office, collecting all dues, working within the retention committee to help keep members from leaving the Council. The Financial Secretary is nominated for this position by the Grand Knight and approved by the Supreme Council. Financial Secretaries normally serve terms of about four years.

Advocate: Is the watchdog for the council to ensure that it follows the rules of the order.

Lecturer: The Lecturer has the duty to provide interesting, entertaining, or even controversial presentations to the council. They can be short presentations at our business meetings, or larger more formal events often open to others. The Lecturer is appointed each year by the Grand Knight.
